**Form & Buffer:** Supplied as solution form in 0.01M PBS, pH7.4, containing 0.05% Proclin-300, 50% glycerol.

#### [ STORAGE AND STABILITY ]

Storage: Avoid repeated freeze/thaw cycles.

Store at 4°C for frequent use.


Aliquot and store at -20°C for 24 months.


**Stability Test:** The thermal stability is described by the loss rate. The loss rate was determined by accelerated thermal degradation test, that is, incubate the protein at 37°C for 48h, and no



obvious degradation and precipitation were observed. The loss rate is less than 5% within the expiration date under appropriate storage condition.
