**Source:** Prokaryotic expression

Host: E.coli

Residues: Glu236~Ala490

**Buffer formulation:** 20mM Tris, 150mM NaCl, pH8.0, containing 0.01% skl, 5%Trehalose.

Applications: Positive Control; Immunogen; SDS-PAGE; WB.

**Predicted isoelectric point: 5.9** 

Predicted Molecular Mass: 30.0kDa

**Accurate Molecular Mass:** 30kDa as determined by SDS-PAGE reducing conditions.

#### [USAGE]

Reconstitute in 20mM Tris, 150mM NaCl (pH8.0) to a concentration of 0.1-1.0 mg/mL. Do not vortex.

#### [ STORAGE AND STABILITY ]

Storage: Avoid repeated freeze/thaw cycles.

Store at 2-8°C for one month.

Aliquot and store at -80°C for 12 months.

**Stability Test:** The thermal stability is described by the loss rate. The loss rate was determined by accelerated thermal degradation test, that is, incubate the protein at 37°C for 48h, and no obvious degradation and precipitation were observed. The loss rate is less than 5% within the expiration date under appropriate storage condition.




Figure. Gene Sequencing (Extract)




Figure. SDS-PAGE
