Source: Prokaryotic expression

Host: *E.coli*

Residues: Met1~Ser355

Subcellular Location: Nucleus, Endoplasmic reticulum lumen, Chromosome

Traits: Freeze-dried powder

Buffer formulation: PBS, pH7.4, containing 0.01% Sarcosyl, 5% Trehalose.

Applications: Positive Control; Immunogen; SDS-PAGE; WB.

Predicted isoelectric point: 9.7

Predicted Molecular Mass: 42.8kDa

Accurate Molecular Mass: 43kDa as determined by SDS-PAGE reducing conditions.

[USAGE]

Reconstitute in ddH₂O to a concentration of 0.1-0.5 mg/mL. Do not vortex.

[STORAGE AND STABILITY]

Storage: Avoid repeated freeze/thaw cycles.

Store at 2-8°C for one month.

Aliquot and store at -80°C for 12 months.

Stability Test: The thermal stability is described by the loss rate. The loss rate was determined by accelerated thermal degradation test, that is, incubate the protein at 37°C for 48h, and no obvious degradation and precipitation were observed. The loss rate is less than 5% within the expiration date under appropriate storage condition.

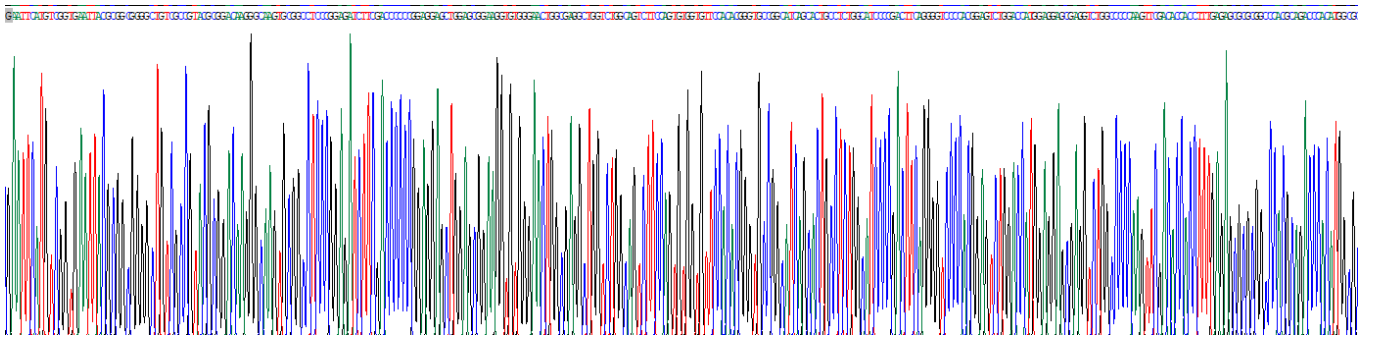


Figure . Gene Sequencing (extract)

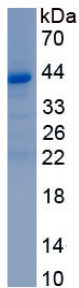


Figure. SDS-PAGE
